ATLANTA'S PONCE CITY MARKET BEGINS VERTICAL CONSTRUCTION ON 619 PONCE: SUSTAINABLE MASS TIMBER LOFT OFFICE BUILDING

New Building to be Constructed with Local, Georgia-Grown Timber and Target Net Neutral Operational Carbon, Redefining Sustainable Mass Timber Construction in the Southeast U.S.

Atlanta, GA (February 27, 2023) – <u>Jamestown</u>, a design-focused real estate investment and management firm, today announced the start of vertical construction on 619 Ponce, a four-story mass timber loft office building at <u>Ponce City Market</u> in Atlanta. The building, which includes 85,000 square feet of office space and 25,000 square feet of retail space, is being constructed with local, Georgia-grown timber and targeting net neutral operational carbon.

Whereas most timber for mass timber construction is currently sourced from Canada, Austria or Germany, Jamestown is utilizing timber sourced and produced locally. Jamestown's use of Georgia-grown timber and a regional supply chain – a first for mass timber construction in Georgia – reduces the project's transportation emissions and the overall environmental impact of construction, maximizing the sustainability benefits of mass timber.

"Mass timber is the future of sustainable development, and the future of mass timber is locally sourced," says **Michael Phillips, President of Jamestown**. "619 Ponce will help redefine sustainable mass timber construction in the Southeast, providing developers and architects with a clear path forward for using local timber."

According to the Georgia Forestry Foundation, Georgia is particularly well positioned as a leader in forest product manufacturing and sustainable forest management with two-thirds of the state's land area covered in forests. "Ponce City Market has been a beacon of sustainable redevelopment for Atlanta and the State of Georgia," said **Andres Villegas, President & CEO of the Georgia Forestry Foundation**. "Jamestown is leading the way again with our state's first Georgia-grown mass timber project, showcasing the ability of Georgia's working forests to capture carbon and sustainably support the needs of a growing state."

The building's columns, beams, and floor slabs are made of local southern yellow pine sawtimber harvested from Georgia forests, including from timberland Jamestown owns and sustainability manages near Columbus, Georgia. Jamestown owns and sustainably manages more than 100,000 acres of timberlands across Georgia, Alabama, South Carolina, New York, Pennsylvania, and Indiana. The timberland is managed under the 2022 SFI® Forest Management Standard, which provides third-party verification of sustainable forestry management based on a number of factors, including measures to protect water quality, biodiversity, wildlife habitat, and threatened and endangered species.

The sawtimber was transported to <u>Georgia-Pacific</u>'s sawmill in Albany, Georgia, where it was converted into lumber. The lumber was then transported to <u>SmartLam</u>'s mass timber plant in Dothan, Alabama, where it was manufactured into cross laminated timber (CLT) panels. The CLT panels will be erected onsite at Ponce City Market by <u>StructureCraft</u> and <u>J.E. Dunn</u>, with building completion expected in 2024.

"Since starting as a small lumber manufacturer in 1927, Georgia-Pacific has a rich history of innovation in the building products industry," said **Fritz Mason, President of Lumber at Georgia-Pacific**. "As pioneers in the use of southern yellow pine, we're proud to support Jamestown and SmartLam as they work to usher in the evolution of southern yellow pine in mass timber construction."

The use of locally sourced mass timber at 619 Ponce complements Jamestown's broader sustainability commitments. The real estate investment and management firm has committed to achieve net zero operational carbon by 2050 and adopted all 17 of the United Nations Sustainable Development Goals.

"Mass timber is a sustainable building material with a low carbon footprint, relative to traditional materials like concrete and steel," said **Catherine Pfeiffenberger, Managing Director and Head of Development & Construction at Jamestown**. "Mass timber is also cleaner to construct, which aids in reducing carbon emissions during construction. Of equal importance, mass timber provides a warm, healthy, and welcoming work environment for the people who will occupy the space."

Designed with a focus on sustainability and wellness, 619 Ponce is targeting net neutral operational carbon, LEED Core & Shell certification, and Fitwel certification. Additionally, the project aims to leverage best practices for material specification, prioritizing human health by minimizing chemicals of concern in building materials with special focus on interior high touch elements. Material selections prioritize embodied carbon reduction and support of the local economy by sourcing materials from within 100 miles where possible. <u>Handel Architects</u> is the Design Architect and Architect of Record for the project.

Amenities at 619 Ponce will include onsite daycare and medical facilities, direct access to the Atlanta BeltLine, bike storage, and complimentary access to The Roof at Ponce City Market. In addition to outdoor space on every level, the building's biophilic design will feature natural wood columns and ceilings and floor-to-ceiling windows with operable panels.

619 Ponce is part of <u>Ponce City Market's next phase</u>, which also includes a flexible-stay hospitality living building featuring 405 furnished units with short-term and long-term stay options and Signal House, a multi-family rental building designed for active adults and the 55+ community.

Ponce City Market first opened its doors in 2015 and has since been credited as the catalyst for revitalizing Atlanta's Old Fourth Ward neighborhood. Today, Ponce City Market has become a major employment hub for creative and technology companies and is currently home to 90 businesses. The new development is projected to bring more than 550 long-term jobs to the campus. In total, Ponce City Market will house some 100 businesses collectively employing more than 5,750 people and will include over 800 residences when the project is complete and fully activated.
